tute the following Resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That our Senators and Representatives in the Congress of the United States, be requested to use their exertions to procure appropriations sufficient to provide that the channels of the Rivers Nant coke, Morokin, Annamessex, Pocomoke and Wicomico, the Straits of Hooper and Cajey, and the Sounds of Tangier and Pocomoke, may be distinctly marked out and made easy of ingress and egress, by the placing of Buoys at proper sites, and that a sufficient sum be also appropriated for the pay of keepers of the said Buoys.

Further resolved, That His Excellency the Governor, be requested to forward a copy of the aforegoing Resolution to each of our Senators and Representatives

in Congress.
