

SATURDAY, January 9th, 1836.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, An act for the benefit of William Jenkins, former collector of Anne Arundel county, passed by the Senate on yesterday, was returned to the House of Delegates.

The Senate adjourned until Monday morning 10 o'clock.

MONDAY, January 11th, 1836.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Mr. Morris appeared in the Senate Chamber.

The President laid before the Senate, letters from Nathaniel F. Williams and William Fell Johnson, Esqrs. members elect of the Council, communicating their acceptance of the appointment,

Which were read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following resolutions:

A resolution for erecting Light Houses and the placing of Bouys in the waters of the Chesapeake Bay,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Page, Hughlett, and Emory.

And a resolution in favor of Alexander Benson Coe,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on Revolutionary Claims.

Also the following bills:

A bill entitled, An act to extend the power of the Commissioners for Tabor county, for the purposes therein mentioned,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Hughlett, Groome and Wootton.

A bill entitled, An act to confirm an act passed December session 1834, chapter 219,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Emory, Morris and Page.
