

WEDNESDAY, January 13, 1836.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday, except Mr. Sappington.

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Morris from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise Thomas Baldwin present Sheriff of Prince George's county to bond as Sheriff of said county at any time before the thirteenth of February next, and to authorise the clerk of said county to receive and record said bond, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time and passed.

Mr. Morris presented a memorial from the Baltimore Water Company praying the passage of a law to close up a portion of St. Paul's Street and Lovegrove Alley, near a reservoir now constructing.

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Morris, Mayer and Hughlett.

Mr. Morris from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to condemn and make public an Alley called West Alley, in the city of Baltimore, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time and passed.
