FRIDAY, January 15th, 1836.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The letter from John C. Henry, Esquire, a member elect of the Council, received yesterday by the Senate, and

The bill entitled, an act for shutting up certain parts of Saint Paul's street, and of Lovegrove Alley in the city of Baltimore, passed by the Senate on yesterday, were sent to the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following resolutions:

A resolution in favor of Sarah Easton, and

A resolution in favor of Mary Holland,

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on Revolutionary Claims.

Also, a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Allen Elder, of the city of Baltimore,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on Insolvency.

On motion of Mr. Wilson,

The resolution relative to certain Rivers, Streights and Sounds, was taken up for consideration.

The amendment heretofore reported, was read and assented to.

The resolution was then read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to, and returned to the House of Delegates.
