Which was read the first and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the

A bill entitled, an act to divorce Elizabeth Gibson, of the city of Baltimore, from her husband John Gibson,

Which was read the first time and referred to the com-

mittee on Divorces.

A bill entitled, an act to divorce James Alford of the city of Baltimore, from his wife Jane Alford.

Which was read the first time and referred to the com-

mittee on Divorces.

A bill entitled, an act for the relief of the old citizens of Frederick city in Frederick county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs.

Sappington, Emory and Morris.

A bill entitled, a supplement to the act to regulate the meetings of the Orphans court of Anne Arundel county, passed at December session 1831, chapter 245,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs.

Claude, Wootton and Wilson.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act to incorporate the Patapsco Insurance Company,

Was read the third time by special order and passed. Mr. Emory from the committee on the militia to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the establishment and regulation of the Baltimore City Guards, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third

time and passed.

Mr. Claude from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate the meetings of the Orphans court of Anne Arundel county, passed at December session 1831, chapter 248, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

Strike out all the 1st section after the word "necessary" in the third line, and insert the words "for the public convenience."

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time and passed.
