

WEDNESDAY, January 20, 1836.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to provide for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland, and for the completion of the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road to the borough of York in the state of Pennsylvania, passed by the Senate on yesterday, was sent, and

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of William Adams, also passed by the Senate on yesterday with an amendment, and

The bill entitled, an act for the opening and extension of Currant's Alley in the city of Baltimore, rejected by the Senate on yesterday, were returned to the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to regulate constables fees in Allegany county,

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Queen Ann's County Silk Company,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Emory, Groome and Osborn.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise Samuel Latimore of Charles county, to bring into this state a negro slave therein named,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on colored population.

Mr. Emory from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Queen Ann's County Silk Company, reported favorably thereon,

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Emory,

The bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to reduce into one the several acts of Assembly respecting elections and to regulate said elections,

Was read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the House of Delegates.
