Claude, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an act to regulate the rate of interest in this state.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

The bill entitled, an act for the better regulation of the militia of the city of Baltimore,

Was read the third time by special order and passed.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

Leave was granted to the committee on judicial proceedings, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, a supplement to an act relating to the records of conveyances in the several counties of this state, passed at December session 1833, chapter 88.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10

o'elock.

- FRIDAY, January 22nd, 1836.

Which was read the first time.

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on Revolutionary Claims.
