Mr. Sappington and Mr. Montgomery appeared and resumed their seats.

The resolution in favor of Mary Holland, and

The resolution in favor of Sarah Eastman, severally assented to on Friday, were returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Morris presented the memorial of the New Market Fire Company, praying for a law to authorise the conveyance of a certain lot of ground situated on the East side of Eutaw street,

Which was read and referred to the committee on Invalid Deeds and Defective Proceedings.

The President laid before the Senate the report of the Secretary to the Board of Trustees of the Harford County Academy,

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following resolutions:

A resolution in favor of Samuel Carey and John E. Carey,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on Finance.

A resolution in favor of William B. Stevenson use of Sarah Deaver,

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Revolutionary Claims.
