A bill entitled, an act to provide for the payment of
jurors and state witnesses in Montgomery county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs.
Claude, Page, and Montgomery.

A bill entitled, an act to alter and amend an act pro-
viding for the appointment of Lime Inspectors for the
city of Baltimore, and prescribing their duties,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs.
Morris, Page and Osborne.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise Richard Linthicum
and William Linthicum to build a bridge over Gwynn's
Falls, at or near where the present bridge now stands,
known by the name of the Long Bridge,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs.
Morris, Page and Montgomery.

A bill entitled, an act to alter and amend an act entit-
led, "an act to provide for electing commissioners for
Baltimore county, and prescribing their duties,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs.
Morris, Groome and Wilson.

A bill entitled, an act to divorce Susan Stewart of
Charles county, from her husband John W. Stewart,
and

A bill entitled, an act to divorce Andrew Young of
the city of Baltimore, from his wife Maria Young,

Which were severally read the first time and referred
to the committee on Divorces.

Mr. Sappington from the committee to which was re-
ferred the bill entitled, an act authorising the Judges of
the Levy Court of Frederick county in their discretion,
to levy a sum of money to build a bridge over Catoctin
creek, on the public road leading from Middletown, by
the late John Shafers mill, now David Ramsburgh's mill,
reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third
time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.
