Mr. Page from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Kent county to record a deed therein mentioned, reported favorably thereon.

Mr. Morris from the committee on Finance, to which was referred the resolution in favor of Samuel Carey and John E. Carey, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time and assented to.

Mr. Morris from the committee to which was referred the resolution in favor of Captain John A. Webster, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

Mr. Page presented the memorial of John B. Morris praying an enquiry into the facts therein set forth, and the causes which led to the mob in Baltimore and whether the expedients devised by law for its suppression were within the reach and used by the corporate authorities, and whether the civil power was not abandoned at the time the injury was inflicted, for which indemnity is prayed.

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Page, Mayer, Sappington, Groome and Claude.

Mr. Page having declined serving as chairman of the committee to which the memorial was referred, Mr. Mayer was appointed.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.
