President and Directors of said company so to construct the said road across such established road or way as not to impede the passage or transportations of persons or property along the same, and when it shall be necessary to pass through the lands of any individual, it shall also be their duty to provide for such individual proper wagon ways across said road."

The bill was then read the second and by special or-

der the third time and passed.

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act to regulate the rate of interest in this state,
