Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We propose with the concurrence of your honorable body, to appoint a joint committee to enquire into and report as soon as practicable to this or the next Legislature, the manner in which the public monies appropriated for the construction of works of internal improvement in this State, have been expended, and that they be empowered to send for persons and papers and examine under oath, all persons employed by the several companies incorporated by this State, and to sit if necessary during the recess of the Legislature.
