Also, a bill entitled, an act to authorise the improvement of an Island therein named,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs.

Montgomery, Groonie and Mayer.

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, an act to make valid a certain deed therein mentioned, from Bene S. Pigman to Richard Coale, endorsed "will pass."

Mr. Mayer submitted the following order,

Which was read and adopted:

Ordered that the committee on printing be instructed to inquire into the practicability of having the acts of the present session and future sessions printed immediately upon their being severally passed; so as nearly as possible to have the printing of all the acts of every session completed by the close of such session; and that the committee have leave to report by bill or otherwise.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act relating to the jurisdiction and powers now vested in

justices of the peace for the city of Baltimore,

Which was read the first time. On motion of Mr. Wootton,

The bill entitled, an act to alter and amend an act providing for the appointment of Lime Inspectors for the city of Baltimore and prescribing their duties, was taken up for consideration,

It was being read the third time, when

On motion of Mr. Wootton,

The following amendment was read and adopted:

At the end of the 1st section add:

That it shall not be lawful for any person or persons residing in the city of Baltimore to sell or dispose of any lime in barrels or casks, which shall not have been first inspected and branded by some one of the inspectors appointed under this act; and that any person or persons so selling or disposing of any lime in barrels or casks, not branded by some one of the said inspectors, shall forfeit for each and every offence the sum of ten dollars, to be recovered before some justice of the peace in said city.

The bill was then read through and passed.

Mr. Morris from the committee on finance to which was referred the resolution in favor of the commissioners for Anne Arundel county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.
