We also lay before you a communication from the Hon. Joseph Kent, one of the Senators of this state in the Congress of the United States, acknowledging the receipt of the Resolutions which you recently passed, on the subject of marking out and placing of Buoys at proper sites to designate the channels of the rivers Nanticoke, Monokin, Annamessex, Pocomoke and Wicomico, and the straits of Hooper and Cagey, and the sounds of Tangier and Pocomoke.
