February 10, 1836.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the State Librarian be directed to furnish to the warden of the goal of the city and county of Baltimore out of the surplus copies in the Library, one copy of the acts of Assembly heretofore passed, and one copy of the present and future sessions of the General Assembly, the same to be kept for the use of the governor and visitors of said goal.

Read the third time by special order and assented to.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution relative to appointing commissioners to have a certain survey made,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on internal improvement.
