

Also, the following Bills:

A bill entitled, an act relating to Aisquith street in the city of Baltimore,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Morris, Mayer and Sappington.

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act passed at December session 1831, chapter 96, entitled, an act to authorise and empower the commissioners of Cecil county to build a bridge over the Big North East Creek, at or near William Phipps' in said county,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Groome, Osborn and Mayer.

Mr. Hughlett from the committee on revolutionary claims to which was referred the resolution in favor of Ara Marr, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time assented to, and returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

It was ordered that the Senate now proceed to the election of a Director on the part of the state in the Bank of Baltimore,

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

George C. Morton was put in nomination,

The ballot box was prepared and the ballots deposited therein, and on examination thereof it appeared there had been 9 votes given, all of which were for George C. Morton.

Whereupon it was declared that George C. Morton, is duly elected a Director on the part of the state in the Bank of Baltimore for the present year.

The senate then proceeded to the election of Bank Directors on the part of the state, in conformity with the arrangement made with the house of delegates. The ballot box was prepared and the ballots deposited therein. It was sealed up and delivered to Messrs. Page and Groome, who had been appointed conjointly with the committee of the house of delegates to count the ballots and report the result. They retired and after a time returned and reported that on examination they had found there had been 69 votes given in all—of which for the Mechanics Bank of Baltimore, Francis Neale had 49 votes and John W. Smith had 43 votes; for the Farmers Bank of Maryland, Nicholas Brewer, junr. had 42 votes, George Wells had 41 votes and Benjamin L. Gantt had 60 votes; for the Branch Bank at Easton, James Price had 43 votes, William Hughlett had 41 votes and Thomas H. Hicks had 35 votes; for the Elk-
