THURSDAY, February 11th, 1836.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution directing the Librarian to deliver to the warden of the jail of Baltimore city and county certain acts of Assembly, assented to by the Senate on yesterday, was sent to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Hughlett presented the report of the trustees of the

Academy at Easton,

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

Mr. Hughlett submitted the following report:

Which was read, and the resolution to which it refers,

read the second time,

The committee on revolutionary claims, to whom was referred the resolution from the House of Delegates, in favor of the heirs of Thomas Goldsmith, "directing the Register of the land office of the Western Shore, to issue a land warrant, for two hundred acres of land, of any vacant land in Allegany county westward of Fort Cumberland, to James Mills, Thomas Mills, Elizabeth Mills, Sarah Canfield and Harriet Goldsmith, heirs at law of Thomas Goldsmith, deceased, and their heirs, without any titling from the Freasurer of the Western Shore of Maryland."

Upon a full investigation of the case, find that the state caused lots of land to be laid off, containing fifty acres each to satisfy the claims of the officers and soldiers of the Maryland line, and that the residue of the vacant land has been directed to be sold. If the claim of the heirs of Thomas Goldsmith be well founded, ample provision has been made for them—but if by their own negligence, they have not availed themselves of the bounty of the state, it is their own negligence. We are well advised there is no vacant land in Allegany county; and that persons to whom warrants have been heretofore issued, can find no vacant land there. We therefore recommend the rejection of the resolution.

On motion of Mr. Pigman,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Pigman, Sappington and Mayer, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act for the preservation and repair of that part of the United States Road, within the limits of the state of Maryland.

Mr. Pigman presented the memorial of Matthew St. Clair Clark, President of the Maryland Mining Company,
