perintendant shall be entirled to receive and shall be paid an annual salary of six hundred dollars and shall also be allowed to charge & take in addition thereto, a commission of five per centum on all sums of money disbursed by him, in lieu of the compensation, provided to be paid him by the act to which this is a supplement.

6th Section, after the words "provisions of this Act, and insert "and all the provisions of the Act to which this is a supplement which allow any exemptions to any persons or to the property cannon or military stores of the United

States.

The Senate adjourned until to- morrow morning 10 o'clock.

## THURSDAY, February 18th, 1836.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday.
