

THURSDAY, February 25th, 1836.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Hughlett from the committee on revolutionary claims to which was referred the resolution in favor of Milly Power, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Montgomery presented the petition of sundry inhabitants of Baltimore county, for the passage of a law for the regulation of the Baltimore Markets,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Morris, Mayer and Wootton.

Mr. Sappington from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of David Hershey and Thomas Hodges, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to.

In the 2nd line of the 1st section after the word "appeal" insert the words "to be allowed in the discretion of the court."

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Sappington from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Elizabeth and Henry Fouke, of Washington county, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought not to pass.

It was read the second time.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following resolutions:

A resolution in favor of the Patapsco Female Institute, and

A resolution in favor of James S. Morsell,

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

Also, the following Bills:

A bill entitled, an act to regulate the manner of obtaining and altering public roads in Montgomery county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Claude and Wootton.
