

A bill entitled, an act to divorce Mary E. Lewis of the city of Baltimore, from her husband William B. Lewis,

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Divorces.

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the preservation and repair of that part of the United States Road within the limits of the state of Maryland, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments,"

Which amendments were read, and were as follows:

Strike out the fifth section, and insert the following in lieu thereof:

"Sec. 5. And be it enacted, That the superintendant of said road, report regularly to the commissioners of Allegany county, at each of their stated meetings, a full statement of the condition of said road, the amount of tolls received, and the amount expended on account of said road, and what balance, if any, in hand; and it shall be the duty of the said commissioners, to transmit said reports immediately to the Treasurer of the Western Shore, to be submitted by him to the Legislature."

Insert after the word "Maryland" in the 7th section, 3d line, the following:

"Until the new location on part of said road shall be completed, then to apply only to the new location, but that tolls shall still continue to be charged upon the old road."

Also returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, an act for the better regulation of the militia of the city of Baltimore, endorsed "will not pass."

Mr. Hughlett from the committee on revolutionary claims to which was referred the resolution in favor of Anna Maria Smyth, and

The resolution in favor of Rebecca Robinson, reported that the committee had had said resolutions under consideration and were of opinion they ought not to be assented to.

They were severally read the second time.

Mr. Mayer presented the memorial of William Frick, and others, praying an act to make valid a certain deed,

Which was read and referred to the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings.

Mr. Hughlett from the committee on revolutionary claims to which was referred the resolution in favor of Mary Linn, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the House of Delegates.
