The bill was then read through, and

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

Read the third time by special order, passed and returned

to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act directing the manner of suing out attachments in this Province and limiting the extent of them, passed at April session, of the year 1715, chapter 40,

Which was read the first time.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

The bill entitled, an act relating to limited partnerships, was made the order of the day for to-morrow, (Friday,) the 26th inst.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10

o'clock.

## FRIDAY, February 26th, 1836.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

The amendments proposed by the House of Delegates, to the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act for the preservation and repair of that part of the United States Road within the limits of the State of Maryland, were read and dissented from.

Mr. Mayer then submitted the following message,

Which was read and adopted, and with the bill, sent to the House of Delegates.

By the Senate,

February 26th, 1836.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

We are constrained to dissent from the amendments proposed by your honorable body, to the supplemental bill from the Senate, providing for the repair and preservation of the National Road. We therefore return it, and respectfully ask your re-consideration of it.
