

On motion of Mr. Pigman,
 Leave was granted to Messrs. Pigman, Mayer and Claude,
 to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an act to incor-
 porate the Eutaw Company.

Mr. Morris from the committee on finance to which was
 referred the resolution in favor of James S. Morsell,

The resolution in favor of Josiah Bayly, and

The resolution in favor of the Patapsco Female Institute,
 reported favorably thereon.

They were severally read the second and by special order
 the third time assented to and returned to the House of Dele-
 gates.

The bill entitled, an act relating to the form in which
 promissory notes may be given to the incorporated Banks
 of this state, was read the second time and ordered to be
 engrossed for a third reading,

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

Read the third time by special order passed and sent to
 the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

It was ordered, that 500 copies of the names attached to
 the memorials for and against indemnifying the sufferers by
 the riots in Baltimore in August last, be printed for the use
 of the General Assembly.

Mr. Pigman from the committee to which was referred
 the petition of Wm. Carroll, reported a bill entitled, an act
 to incorporate the Town Hill Mining, Manufacturing and
 Timber Company,

Which was read the first time.

On motion of Mr. Hughlett,

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Thomas N.
 Muir, was read the third time by special order, and amend-
 ed as follows:

At the end of the bill add:

“Provided however, that such sale shall not take place
 until petition be filed by the mother of said Thomas as his
 guardian, to the said orphans court, praying the said sale;
 and that the answer of said infant by guardian to be appoin-
 end for the occasion by the court be filed, and that thereup-
 on the court be satisfied that a sale will be beneficial for said
 infant, and then order the sale accordingly.”

The bill was then passed and returned to the House of
 Delegates.

The Senate adjourned until Monday morning 10
 o'clock.
