

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

The bill entitled, an act to authorize Edward E. Hall of Baltimore county, and Samuel T. Stonestreet of Montgomery county, to sell the real and personal estate of Elisha J. Hall, late of Baltimore county, deceased, was taken up for consideration.

The amendments heretofore reported, were read and adopted.

The bill was then read the second time and further amended, as follows:

Add as an additional section to the bill,

And be it enacted, That in place of a proceeding to be hereafter instituted as aforesaid, on bill or petition, the court of chancery may proceed, upon being satisfied as aforesaid, and in manner aforesaid, to decree a sale of said land and property as above provided, upon the bill or petition for such sale now pending in the Court of Chancery.

Amend the title of the bill as follows:

An act to authorize the sale of the real and personal estate of Elisha J. Hall.
