

Mr. Groome from the committee on divorces, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to divorce Sarah A. Hall of Frederick county, from her husband John H. Hall, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass, with the following amendment, which was read and assented to.

Strike out all after the enacting clause, and insert in lieu thereof, the following words, viz:

That from and after the passage of this act, Sarah A. Hall of Frederick county be and she is hereby divorced a men sa et thoro from her husband John H. Hall.

The bill was then read the second time.

Mr. Groome from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to divorce Eliza Anne Boyd, of Kent county, from her husband James Boyd, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass, with the following amendment, which was read and assented to.

Strike out all after the enacting clause and insert in lieu thereof, the words following:

That from and after the passage of this act Eliza Ann Boyd of Kent county, be and she is hereby divorced from bed, board and mutnal cohabitation with her husband James Boyd.

The bill was read the second time, and on motion of Mr. Mayer, amended as follows:

*And be it enacted;* That the said Eliza Ann Boyd be, and she is hereby declared to every effect to be entitled to all the rights and privileges of a feme sole, excepting the privilege of marrying again, during the life time of her said ghusband, and she is hereby dclared to be entitled to the guardianship of her children, by her marriage with said Boyd.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

The bill was read the third time by special order and passed.

The Senate adjourned until ot-morrow morning at 10 o'clock.
