

WEDNESDAY, March 9th, 1836.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The Preamble and resolutions relative to so much of the Act of 1834, as provides for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland, assented to by the Senate on yesterday, with an amendment, and the bill entitled an act to authorize Edward E. Hall of Baltimore county and Samuel T. Stonestreet of Montgomery county, to sell the real and personal estate of Elisha J. Hall, late of Baltimore county, deceased.

The bill entitled an act to authorize the improvement of an island therein named, and the bill entitled an act to divorce Eliza Ann Boyd of Kent County from her husband James Boyd, severally passed by the Senate on yesterday, with amendments, were returned to the house of Delegates.

Mr. Wilson from the committee to which was referred the bill, entitled an act to authorise Edward Dymock and others to purchase, receive and hold certain real estate for a parsonage in Worcester County on Snowhill Circuit for the use and benefit of the Methodist Episcopal Church in said Circuit and for other purposes, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Montgomery from the committee, to which was referred the bill, entitled an act for the relief of John Guyton of Hardford County, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which were read and assented to:

In the 1st section, 2d line, strike out from the word "and" to the word "to" and insert "directed."

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Wilson from the committee to which was referred the bill, entitled an act to condemn and lay off a lot of ground, for a public wharf and lumber yard at Mattaponi landing on the Pocomoke river in Worcester county reported favorably thereon.
