The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act to incorporate the town of Boonsborough, and the several additions thereto,

Which was read the first time and referred to messrs. Pigman, Claude and Sappington.

A bill entitled an act relating to lotteries in the State of Maryland,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to prevent the destruction of oysters in the waters of this state, passed at December session 1833, chapter 254, so far as relates to St. Mary's county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Wootton, Page and Morris.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower persons owning real estate on any of the navigable rivers of this state, to construct wharves thereon,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Montgomery, Mayer and Wilson.
