

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act to incorporate the Merchants' Fire Insurance Company of Baltimore, was read the third time passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The President announced the order of the day—being the bill entitled a further supplement to the act entitled an act to incorporate the Delaware and Maryland Rail Road Company.

The bill was read the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled an act to divorce Catharine Hyland from her husband Benjamin Hyland,

And a bill entitled an act to divorce John Dolan of the city of Baltimore, from his wife Margaret Dolan,

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on divorces.

A bill entitled an act to lay out and open a new road Frederick and Baltimore counties, passed at December session, 1832, chapter 23,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Mayer and Claude.

A bill entitled, an act for the better preservation of the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

A bill entitled a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, passed at November session 1805,

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on insolvency.

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Western Bank of Baltimore, and

A bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to establish state warehouses, for the inspection of Tobacco in the city of Baltimore,

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

A bill entitled, an act vesting certain powers in the commissioners for Talbot county, for the purposes therein named,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Hughlett, Wilson and Emory.
