

Mr. Emory from the committee on the Militia, reported a bill, entitled an additional supplement to the act, entitled an act for the better regulation of the militia of the city of Baltimore, passed at December Session, 1823, chapter 188, which was read the first and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading. It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

Read the third time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates, delivered the engrossed bills of the house of delegates, from No. 92 to to No. 208, inclusive,

Which were read, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled an act for enlarging and extending Lexington Market in the city of Baltimore, was read the third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

His Excellency Governor Veazey appeared in the Senate Chamber.

On motion of Mr. Hughlett,

It was ordered that Messrs. Hughlett and Montgomery inform the house of delegates, that his Excellency Governor Veazey is in the Senate Chamber, prepared to sign the engrossed bills, and request their attendance to witness the ceremony. They retired and after a time returned and reported that they had performed the duty assigned them.

Accordingly the Speaker and members of the house of delegates, appeared in the Senate, when his Excellency Gov. Veazey, signed the engrossed bills, from No. 92, to No. 208 inclusive, in the presence of the General Assembly in conformity with the requirements of the Constitution.

The Speaker and members of the house of delegates retired.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.
