

the bill entitled, an act to provide for taking the sense of the people of Baltimore county, on the propriety of separating said county from the city of Baltimore, and

The bill entitled, an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act respecting Hay and Straw brought for sale to the city of Baltimore, reported that the committee had had said bills under consideration and were of opinion ought not to pass.

They were severally read the second time.

Mr. Morris from the committee on finance to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Farmers and Millers Bank of Hagerstown, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Boston and New York Coal Company, was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading,

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Mayer presented the memorial of the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company, for authority to alter the location of their road between certain specified points,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Montgomery and Morris.

The bill entitled, an act for the incorporation of the Great Council of the state of Maryland, of the Order of Improved Red Men, was read the second time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

The President asked leave to state upon the journal, his approval of the passage of the bill entitled, an act to provide indemnity to the sufferers by certain riots in the city of Baltimore, which passed the Senate on Tuesday the 22d instant, while he was absent from the seat of government.

On motion of Mr. Groome,

Leave was granted to him.

On motion of Mr. Emory,

Like leave was granted to him.

On motion of Mr. Sappington,

The amendments proposed by the house of delegates, to the bill entitled, an act supplementary to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Union Company, were read and dissented from.
