Also the following resolutions:

A resolution in favor of the Rev. John Poisel and the Rev. George McElhinney,

A resolution relative to the Maryland Hospital, and

A resolution relative to a warehouse in the city of Baltimore,

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

A resolution requiring the armourer to deliver certain arms to captain Smith, of Baltimore,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the militia.

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act relating to free negroes and slaves, endorsed "will pass."

Also returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, an act to incorporate the George's Creek Mining Company, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments,"

Which were read and adopted, and were as follows:

In the first section, strike out the word "perpetual."

In the first section, 19th line, after the words "Potomac river," insert the following, "near the mouth of George's creek."

In the first section, 21st line, strike out the word "usually" and insert in lieu thereof the word "necessary."

In the third section, 4th line, after the word "Governor," insert "at Cumberland and."
