

In the third section, 8th line, after the word "Baltimore," insert the following, "and the town of Cumberland."

In the fifth section, after the word "Washington," insert the words "and the town of Cumberland."

In the 7th line, tenth section, strike out from the word "proper" to the word "provided" in the 10th line, and insert in lieu thereof the following:

"Provided, the toll on said road or roads, shall not exceed one cent per ton per mile, on all coal, merchandise or other property transported on said rail road or roads, nor more than two cents per mile for each and every passenger so transported on said road or roads."

In the tenth section, thirteenth line, insert after the word "incorporated," the following, "that to be determined on by the commissioners of Allegany county."

Add as an additional section the following, to come at the end of the bill.

"And be it enacted, That this act nor no part thereof, shall be so construed as to give the said corporation any banking privileges."

On motion of Mr. Pigman,

The amendments proposed by the house of delegates, to the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act for the preservation and repair of that part of the United States Road within the limits of the state of Maryland, were taken up for consideration, and assented to.

Mr. Pigman from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to provide for public instruction of youth in primary schools throughout this state, passed at December session 1825, chapter 162, so far as it relates to Montgomery county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Wilson from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to repeal the act of 1831, chapter 38, and the act of 1832, chapter 5, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought not to pass.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Emory,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Emory, Wilson and
