

So it was determined in the affirmative, and the bill returned to the house of delegates.

The Clerk of the house delivered the following resolutions.

A resolution in favor of Alexander Cowan and Henry Coulter, and

A resolution for an appropriation to the Government house,

Which was severally read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

Also the following bills:

A bill entitled an act to authorise the clerk of Cecil county court to record an instrument of writing therein mentioned, and to make the same valid,

Which were read the first time and referred to the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings.

A bill entitled an act to incorporate the Citizens bank of Baltimore,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

SATURDAY, April 2, 1836.

The Senate met. Present the same senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Wilson and Mr. Morris who had been appointed in conjunction with a committee of the house of delegates, to wait on His Excellency Governor Veazey and invite his attendance in the Senate Chamber to sign the engrossed bills, reported that they had performed the duty assigned them and had received for answer, that His Excellency would attend at the hour named.

The bill entitled an act to incorporate the Real Estate Bank of Baltimore, was read the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates, delivered a resolution in favor of Jane Mills,

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Revolutionary Claims.
