The proposition will meet the favorable consideration of this body, but as we are incompetent to originate such a proposition, we have reconsidered and rejected the resolution, from the apprehension that the condition of the treasury is not, unquestionably competent to gratify the past and contemplated appropriation, as also defray the interest of the public debt; and request that the resolution may be accompanied by some provision that will obviate the apprehended difficulty.
