SATURDAY, May 28th, 1836.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The clerk of the house of delegates returned the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, an act to authorise the recording of a bill of sale, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment."

Which amendment was read and adopted, and was as follows:

"Provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed to interfere with or impair the rights of creditors or purchasers without notice since the execution of said bill of sale."

Also returned the bill which originated in the senate entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Patuxent Company, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment."

Which amendment was read and adopted, and was as follows:

In the third line insert "July" instead of "May."

Also returned the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, an act for the relief of Elizabeth Kennedy, endorsed, "will pass."

And delivered the bill entitled, an act relating to equity proceedings, endorsed, "amendments read the second time and adopted with the exception of the last amendment, which is dissented from," which was as follows:

"Insert in the second line the word "second" after the word "fourth."
