

TUESDAY, May 31, 1836.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Claude from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an additional supplement to an act incorporating the Annapolis and Potomac Canal Company.

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Emory from the committee on colored population to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise John D. Milbourne to bring certain negroes into this state, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought not to pass.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.
