On motion of Mr. Claude,

Read the third time, by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Morris from the committee on finance to which was referred the resolution in favor of Joseph Alford, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to regulate gates in Kent county, was being read the third time by special order, when

On motion of Mr. Groome,

The following amendment which was assented to by the Senate on yesterday, was re-considered and rejected.

In the 3d section 2nd line, strike out the words "one dollar" and insert the words "two dollars and fifty cents."

On motion of Mr. Groome,

The following amendment was read and assented to.

Strike out from the bill the words "annually a Tax of one dollar" in the 2nd line of the third section, and add at the end of said 3d section, the words "a Tax of one dollar for each of the years 1837 and 1838, and a Tax of two dollars and fifty cents annually for every year thereafter."

The bill was then read through, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Emory from the committee on internal improvement to which was referred the resolution relative to the survey of a route from the village of Quantico in Somerset county, to Salisbury and Princess Anne, reported that the committee had had said resolution under consideration and were of opinion it ought to be assented to with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to.

Add as follows:

And be it further resolved, That the said commissioners shall cause to be surveyed the route of a lateral road to depart at the most convenient point on the proposed Eastern Shore Rail Road, and running from such point to or near the town of Centreville, and from thence passing thro' the most level lands of Queen Anne's and Talbot counties, to or near the town of Easton.
