Duckett and Nowland to join such gentlemen as may be appointed by your honorable body, for the above purpose.

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on revolutionary claims.

Also, a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate the Farmers' and Planters' Bank of Baltimore, passed at December session 1835,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Morris and Emory.

And returned the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorize the Governor and Council to build a new tobacco inspection warehouse in the city of Baltimore, passed at the present session, endorsed, will pass.

Mr. Forrest from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act concerning crimes and punishments,

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Forrest,

Read the third time, by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Page,

It was ordered, that when the Senate adjourns, it shall be adjourned until 4 o'clock, P. M.
