

## FOUR O'CLOCK, P. M.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as in the forenoon.

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Farmers' and Planters' Bank of Baltimore, passed at December session, 1835, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.
