And returned the resolution which originated in the Senate relating to the printing of the laws, endorsed,

"dissented from."

Also delivered, a bill entitled, an act for the payment of the journal of accounts.

Which was read the first time and referred to the com-

mittee on finance. And returned the bill entitled, an act to authorise the removal and discontinuance of a certain draw bridge in the city of Baltimore, endorsed "will pass,"

Also returned the bill which originated in the Senate entitled, an act to incorporate the Eutaw Company, en-

dorsed "will pass."

Also returned the following bills, which originated in

the senate, endorsed "will not pass."

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act, passed at December session of the year 1820 chapter 199, entitled, an act more effectually to prevent the anchoring of ves-
