the right to select the tribunal before which their grievances may be examined and redressed. provided the fair measure of justice to be meted out, shall be as strictly secured before one as another tribunal. We therefore return the bill with the amendment, respectfully asking your honorable body to re-consider and adopt the amendment.

The question.was put,

Will the senate accept the substitute, And it was determined in the negative.

The question was then put,

Will the Senate recede from the said first proposed amendment,

And it was determined in the 'affirmative.

The bill was then passed and, returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Emory submitted the following message, .

Which was read and adopted.

By the Senate,

June 4, 1836.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received the message of your honorable body proposing to adjourn the session this evening at 8 o'clock, and concur with you in the agreement to adjourn sine die, or so soon as the ceremony of signing the engrossed bills shall have been performed.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a reso-

lution in favor of William B. A. Tyler,

Which was read the first and by special order the second and third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Also delivered a resolution directing the armoter to deliver each member of the Senate and House of Delegates,

a patent rifle,

Which was read the first and by special order the second and third time, dissented from and returned to the

house of delegates. And returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, an act to authorise the shutting up a certain road. within the city of Baltimore, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment,"
