Then it was Ordaind that every member of the
House not appearing at the hours appointed should be
fined 20 of Tobacco for every such default but for this
present meeting such as did appear though tardie should
be punished the same manner but for the rest which ap
peared not it should stand

Then were read out of the draught of Laws
transmitted by the Lord Proprietor the twelve first Acts
of the said Draught and were severally debated by the
House
