The committee reported to the House that they
thought fit to read the former drafts of Laws
and to put them to the Vote the next time in Request
there was found a great deal of misapprehension of
them among the freemen which made them to refuse
them

but it being put to the Vote of the House whether
they should be read again or not was affirmed by 48
Yeas and denied by 21 Nays

Then moved and carried by General Consent
of the House that all Bills proposed to the House
for Laws should be read three times on three several
Days before they should be put to the Vote

Then were the drafts of Laws read through
the secret uncensored printing Bills proposed by the
Committee were read the first time

Captain Comstock proposed it might be put to
the Vote of the House whether these Laws at the third
reading should be taken severally or the whole Body
of them together
