Captain Comyns Replyed they would
 not spend their time in any Business better then we
 this for the Counting house and one of the Members
 demanded the reason why it should be adjourned &
 said they were willing to leave their other Business
 to attend it. The President replied he would be
 accountable to his man for his adjournment of it.

Then Captain Comyns moved that at
 least a Committee might be appointed that should
 take charge of preparing the Laws till the House
 met again and being read to the House they agreed that
 the Committee should be appointed. Then everyone
 remembering secretly his three Committees the Pre-
 sident had 40 voices Captain Comyns had 50
 voices Captain Carter 44 voices Mr. Sawyer 31 voices
 Mr. Stone had 5 voices and Captain Mace 4 voices.

Then was it ordered that Privilege of Parliam^t
 men for their Papers should not be allowed till the
 next meeting of the Assembly.

Then the President adjourned the House
 till the 20 of February.
