for the beginning of a Plantation there and bearing well
and ready to our Powers to assist his said Lordship
in all his Rights and Privileges by inflicting penal
ties on all such as shall attempt to violate and infringe
the same in expectation of the like protection and assist-

ance from his Lordship of and for the maintaining &
defending of all our Rights

And further considering how inconvenient it may
and is likely to prove to the State of this Province and the
peace and plenty thereof if a promiscuous liberty of tra-
ding with the said Indians should be permitted and
left open to all persons indifferently in regard that there
by the price of Indian Goods may easily be enhanced
& the slave thereof carried out of the Province by the
reigners in time of our Greatest need and that Fealow-
ers numerous and false news may be spread among the
Indians by ill affected Persons to the disturbance of the
peace and safety of the inhabitants and that Vessels
weakly manned and provided may be and are usually
set forth among Indians disaffected to this Colony where
by both the men have been and may be destroyed and
the Vessels arms and Ammunition thereby taken con-
victed and employed to arm the said Indians against
us have therefore thought it necessary and do desire that
it may be enacted

And be enacted by the Lord Proprietary of
this Province by and with the advice of Council and ap-
probation of the Freeman of the same that no Seamer
