

In Act for erecting a Court
of Admiralty.

Be it enacted by the Lord Proprietary
of this Province by and with the advice and appro-
bation of the Council of the same that all Causes
whatever maritime determinable in any Court of
Admiralty shall be finally heard and determined
within this Province and before the Admiral of the
Province for the time being in by and before such
Judge or Judges as the said Admiral shall Author-
ize to hear and determine the same or by and before
such Commissioner or Commissioners as in default
vacancy of an Admiral the Lord Proprietary of this
Province shall Authorize under the Great Seal to hear
and determine the same which said Admiral or chief
Commissioner shall or may appoint a Register for
recording of all matters belonging to their Office and
the said Admiral or chief Register or chief Commissioner
for the time exercising that office and the said Re-
gister shall be a Colone of Record and shall be called
the Court of Admiralty and the said Court shall
enjoy and exercise all or any the same or the
like powers privileges authorities and jurisdic-
tion within this Province as the high Court of Admi-
ralty in England enjoy or may enjoy and exer-
cise within the Realm of England except where it is
otherwise provided by any law of this Province
But until the said Court have proper seal
affixed to it by the Lord Proprietary all Proceeds
