

to this Court by the Lord Proprietary, all warrants
 process and judicial writs in all causes appertaining
 to the Court shall be drawn and signed by the Regis-
 ter of this Court and such signature shall be suffi-
 cient warrant to the Chancellor or Keeper of the Great
 Seal to put the Great Seal thereto and they shall suffice
 in the name of the Lord Proprietary with the Test
 of the said chief Justice or chief Commissioner and
 shall be directed to the parties themselves or to any wit-
 nesses or to the Sheriff of the County or to any other
 Officer named upon the writ and such forms of
 Process and proceedings upon Bill, plaint, informa-
 tion, presentment, or indictment shall be used and ob-
 served in this Court as are most agreeable to the Laws
 of this Province or otherwise to the forms used and ob-
 served in the Courts of Common Law in England in
 the same or the like causes as near as the Judge or Re-
 gister may well know them or otherwise such forms
 as the said chief Justice shall appoint or approve to
 be used and observed in this Court, except where it
 is otherwise provided by any Law of this Province.

And all questions and demurrers in Law on
 this Court shall be determined by the said chief Jus-
 tice Commissioner or Commissioners and in all pleas
 or matters civil or Criminal in this or any other Court
 within the Province the Lord Proprietary shall be allow-
 ed all the same and the like Privileges as are usually
 or of Right due or belonging to Counts Palatine be-
 long always the Sovereign Dominion due to the King
