 pound of Tobacco for Beating in the hand or multi-
 tation of a member fifty pound of Tobacco for in-
 flicting pains of death one hundred pound of To-
 bacco to be paid out of the Estate of the party punish-
 ed or convicted if sufficient distress may be had or
 otherwise by the _____ of the Province upon the
 account of the Province

To each of the Sergeants or Marshalls of
 Saint Marks or Saint Georges Barre two pounds
 of Tobacco yearly to be paid by every house
 keeper of either of those Barres for him or her self
 and for every one within his or her Family able to
 bear arms and to the Sergeant or Marshall of the
 Isle of Kent four pound of Tobacco

To the Surveyor twenty pound of Tobacco
 for every hundred acres within the Plot Surveyed
 if it be above one hundred acres or otherwise half a
 Pound of Tobacco for every Acre surveyed if it be
 under one hundred acres provided that the Party
 whose Land is surveyed find Bond and Bonds
 & all necessary to such Surveyor instruments ac-
 cepted

To the Coroner for viewing a dead Body and
 Buriall and holding his inquest forty pound
 of Tobacco to be paid of the Estate of the Party whose
 Body is viewed if there be sufficient distress or other-
 wise by the _____ of the Province upon the account
