

time as the defendant shall enter his appearance in the Court and costs and damages which shall be given or awarded to the defendant by reason of any unjust Prosecution of the Plaintiff shall or may seem to take out of the Chancery or hundred Court of Kent a writ of attachment or of execution for such value and in such manner upon the Goods or debts of the defendant within the Province as the Court shall think fit

To which purpose a writ of Execution in like manner as a writ of Attachment before may be sued and taken out of the Chancery or hundred Court of Kent directed to any the debtor or debtors and the debtor or debtors by them acknowledged upon record or recovered by judgment of Court and commanding them and every of them to deliver or be accountable to the Party recovering for all such Tobacco as are in their hands to the value of the sum recovered and all Tobacco's worth Goods delivered or accomplished for by such debtor or debtors by virtue of the said writ shall be discharged to the Party against whom the recovery is had and such delivery or accomplishment shall be a lawful and absolute discharge to the debtor or debtors so delivering or accounting as aforesaid against his or their Creditors for so much as shall be so delivered or accounted for or otherwise such writ or process of execution may be directed to the Sheriff or high Constable or other officer to levy the said debt or acknowledged debt recovered upon any goods of such debtor or debtors against whom such Execution is filed & taken out
