

to be always two / shall be called the house of Assembly and that all Acts and Ordinances assented unto and approved by the said house or by the major Part of the persons assembled and afterward assented unto by the Lieutenant General in the name of the said Lord Proprietary shall be adjudged and established for Laws to all the same force and Effect as if the said Lord Proprietary and all the Freemen of this Province were personally present and did assent to and approve of the same

Which Bill being read and passed by all the Gentlemen and Freemen present they did consent it should be underwritten by the Secretary in these words

[The Freemen have assented to this Bill that it be engrossed and published under the Great Seal]

Then the Lieutenant General Leonard Calvert Esq^r being demanded by the Secretary whether he did assent to the said Bill for and in the name of the Lord Proprietary answered yea and willed that his assent should be underwritten to it, in these words

[The Lieutenant General in the Behalf of the Lord Proprietary willeth that this be a Law]

And it was published under the Great Seal the twelfth of March 1738
