 the Freeman to determine thereof as Judges of the matter  
 in question

112<sup>th</sup> Secretary spake not to the question  
 but as a Councillor that he thought the matter was to  
 be put to the Question and that it could not be rightfully  
 Denied to them and that the house hath power to decide
